



The Temple of The Sacred Tooth Relic


Where tranquility meets spirituality, and hearts find inner peace.

The Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic is a buddhist place of worship where the sacred tooth relic - the left Canine tooth of Gautama Buddha is enshrined. The first temple which housed the sacred tooth relic in Kandy was built by King Wimaladharmasuriya the first (1592 – 1604). Later King Sri Weera Parakrama Narendrasinghe (1707 – 1739) built the two storeid Dalada Madura which one can see today. The temple was finely renovated by King Keerthi Sri Rajasinghe (1798 – 1815) to its present appearance with the addition of Paththirippuwa or the Octagonal Pavilion. In 1988 the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic was named as a world heritage by UNESCO.

Natha, Vishnu, Kataragama, and Paththini temples are located surrounding the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic.

- Dalada Museum
- Raja Tusker Museum
- Royal Palace Archeological Museum (closed on Tuesdays)



The Royal Botanic Gardens

Peradeniya: Where Nature's Beauty Reigns Supreme.

The Royal Botanic Gardens Peradeniya runs as far back as 1371 during King Wickramabahu III's reign. Later, King Kirthi-Sri Rajasinghe from 1747 to 1780 this was made a Royal Garden. The current Botanic Gardens were formed by Mr. Alexander Moon in 1821 six years after the final conquest of the Kandyan Kingdom.

- Extent: 147 acres
- **Species under cultivation :** Over 4000 species including orchids, spices, medicinal plants, palm/woody trees
- **Annual visitor turnout:** 1.2 million
- Attached to it is the "National Herbarium of Sri Lanka"

The Nelligala International Buddhist Centre

Discover Nature's Beauty at Hanthana Bird Park.

The Nelligala International Buddhist Center welcomes visitors of diverse faiths, offering an oasis of peace and tranquility. The golden Buddha statues against the azure sky create a stunning visual contrast. This sacred site houses relics of Lord Buddha, and its wheelchair-accessible facilities ensure a comfortable pilgrimage. Just a short drive from Kandy city, it beckons seekers of serenity.

The Bahiravakanda Viharaya

Sri Lanka's Serene Mountain Oasis.

The Bahirawakanda Buddha Statue which was built in 1972 is in the seated Nirvana pose. It can be seen from the entire city of Kandy. The statue is located alongside the Sri Maha Bodhi Temple which is on the top of the Bahirawa Kanda hill. It stands at 88 feet in height and is one of the biggest Buddha statues in Sri Lanka. The hill gives a panoramic view of the City of Kandy.



The Udawattakele Sanctuary

Where Nature's Secrets Await Your Discovery.

Udawattakele Forest Reserve is a historic forest reserve on a hill-ridge in the city of Kandy which spreads over 257 acres. The sanctuary is famous for its extensive avifauna. Being easily accessible and containing a variety of flora and fauna the forest has a great educational and recreational value. Udawattakele was designated as a forest reserve in 1856, and it became a sanctuary in 1938. The forest is of religious importance as there are three Buddhist meditation hermitages and three rock shelter dwellings for Buddhist monk hermits.



Discover Nature's Beauty at Hanthana Bird Park.


The Bird Park is located in Hanthana. It is home to over 100 bird species, many of which are native to the island including the Sri Lanka Spurfowl, the Sri Lanka Junglefowl, and the Yellow-fronted Barbet. The park covers an area of about 4 acres. In addition to the birds, the park also has a variety of other animals, including monkeys, turtles, and rabbits. There is also a small gift shop where visitors can purchase souvenirs and gifts.


Open Air theater - "Wala" - The Prof. Ediriweera Sarachchandra Open Air Theatre, is a cultural hub and tribute to the renowned playwright. This iconic outdoor venue hosts various artistic performances, combining natural beauty with artistic expression, fostering a vibrant cultural atmosphere within the university.





Akbar Bridge - Built during the British colonial era, it combines classic British design with a touch of Mughal inspiration, featuring ornate arches and intricate stonework. As both a functional structure and a symbol of the university's historical significance, the Akbar Bridge is a cherished part of Peradeniya landscape.


